Section Three: Supplemental Employment Initiatives

Employees continued their radio education with training webinars from the Iowa Association of Broadcasters. Some of the webinar topics included sales tactics and radio production work.

Employees continued their training with software provider Broadcast Electronics to understand how the technology can work with other programs and virus protection software.

Two students from the Mt. Pleasant Community School district came to the radio station for job shadowing positions. They worked along our morning team and learned our radio procedures.

One student from the WACO School district worked for a week as an intern. She worked the morning show, learned how to write new stories and attended community meetings. She then continued her job shadow in the production; learning how to write and then produce spots.

News Director Theresa Rose worked with students at the New London Community High School in their Broadcast Journalist class entitled "Communication Arts" to discuss all aspects of news coverage including: establishing news sources, how to be prepared for interviews, doing interviews and to discuss live coverage of events and activities. Rose provided real life experience and instruction mentorship.

Morgan Bower, a senior English major at local Iowa Wesleyan University is working with KILJ as an intern. She covers local events in town and the university and also writes and produces weekly movie reviews of movies screening at the local theater. Her programs aired every Friday at 5 pm and during the Saturday morning news section for a semester.

News Director Theresa Rose served as an advisor to Iowa Wesleyan University's Communication Department's class. She provided insight and gave a tour to their "Writing for Modern Media" class.

Employee Koehler Wendt participated in the Mount Pleasant Middle School's Career Day program. Students in grades 6 through 8 listened as Wendt spoke to them about various aspects of the radio business including: rules and regulations, jobs of employees and possible career paths in the industry. He also spoke about colleges and beneficial classes.

Staff serve on Southeastern Community College's Foundation Board. This institution services southeast Iowa with campuses in Burlington, Mount Pleasant and Keokuk, Iowa.

Radio station tours were given to local Girl and Boy Scout troops. A visiting TTT group also was given a tour. The station was shown, as well as the technology used and duties of employees were explained.

KILJ helped sponsor the Southeast Iowa Regional Job Fair and participated in the job fair. We spoke to participants about career opportunities and the various avenues available in the industry including marketing, sales, promotions, ad production, news and sports.

Theresa Rose spoke to the Noon Rotary about the radio station, her duties at the station and ethical dilemmas that the news department have to be addressed in her line of work.

General Manager John Kuhens addressed the Evening Rotary and his presentation focused on the history of KILJ and the plans for the future.
